WOW Wall

We are revamping our nursery achievement wall to become more visual and inclusive of both home and nursery achievements, not only for the children but also for parents/carers and staff. It has therefore moved to the nursery foyer for all to see. Achievements can be big or small – e.g. your child sleeping in their own bed for the first time, taking part in a dancing display or a football tournament or certificates for swimming. Parent/carer may like to share achievements such as passing their driving test, gaining a qualification or running a 10k. As well as increasing the opportunities to engage families in the life of the nursery, it is important that children are aware that successes and achievements continue throughout life. We would value your support in taking forward this initiative.



Supporting my Child's Literacy and Numeracy Development

We are inviting parents/carers of pre-school children to a presentation on Thursday 26th September 2019 to discuss ways that you can help to support your child's literacy and numeracy learning at home. The presentation will take place twice in the day to accommodate your child's pattern of attendance and a letter with more information will be handed out shortly.

Family Learning

We have provisionally arranged a Literacy Walk in conjunction with the library for Tuesday 29th October. The walk in Blackwood Park and associated activity will focus on the story 'Room on the Broom'. A letter confirming this date and available time slots will be handed out shortly.

Loose Parts

As part of an initiative within the nursery, we are actively engaging the children in Loose Parts Play. This type of play fosters creativity as the resources allow open-ended opportunities. An example is a cardboard box that to many children could be a car, rocket ship or a robot. We are therefore looking for your support in gathering different resources including:

- Tubes kitchen, cling film, wrapping paper (no toilet rolls)
- Pebbles/stones
- Shells
- CDs/DVDs
- Wooden kitchen utensils
- Guttering
- Corks

Independence

At nursery, we encourage children to be as independent as possible. This starts with being able to put on/take off their jacket and change their shoes. Almost all the children are able to do this and we would be grateful if you could encourage them at the start and end of the session to do these tasks by themselves. It would also aid your child's independence if both their outdoor and indoor shoes were either slip on or had Velcro as laces reduce your child's ability to be independent.

Group Drawers



Each group has a drawer at the entrance to the nursery containing work that can go home – e.g. paintings, collage pictures, writing. We would be grateful if parents/carers could check your child's group drawer on a regular basis.

Outdoor Learning

The majority of the children are engaging almost daily in outdoor learning; however, we have realised that when the children are playing on the grass that it can be very muddy. We would be grateful if you child could have a full change of clothes – top, trousers/skirt, pants and socks in the event that they need changed.

Lost Property

We have only been back at nursery for a few weeks and we have already had lost shoes and jumpers. If you label your child's jackets, indoor and outdoor shoes, jumpers and cardigans, we will be able to reunite children with any lost property.

Change of Clothes

Our current stock of spare clothes is running extremely low, especially trousers and socks. We would kindly ask that any borrowed clothes are returned as quickly as possible.

Peanuts/Nuts

We would like to remind parents/carers that Blackwood Primary School and the Nursery Class is a peanut and nut free zone, as there are children who have an allergy to peanuts and nuts. We would be grateful if you could please check that any food or snacks brought into the nursery do not contain nuts directly or traces of nuts. This includes Kinder products that may contain traces of nuts.

Sun Cream

If you still have a letter about sun cream at home, could you please return the permission form and if you have agreed to leave a bottle of sun cream at nursery could you please hand the labelled bottle into the nursery.

Items to help look after a baby:

- Baby sponges

- Toaster (doesn't need to be working)

- Small empty food colouring bottles
- Milk cartons/coffee jars
- Magazine racks
- Other small food items

Items to help enhance technology:

- Different textures
- Small electrical items that the children could take apart
- Padlocks and keys
- Different sizes of screwdrivers
