Children in Need

Learning in the Nursery

In literacy, we are continuing to talk about stories that have been read and talking about why they liked or disliked them. We are also encouraging the children to use their imagination when engaged in role-play within reallife contexts.

Room on the Broom – Family Learning Event

We would like to thank parents/carers who came along with their child to the Room on the Broom event last week. We were delighted that 98.5% of children were able to take part in this event. Feedback from the event was very positive. As a follow up all the pre-school will have the opportunity to take part in the 'Big Story' from the library service on <u>Thursday 5th December</u> in the morning – afternoon children will be able attend in the morning session for the duration of the event. Exact details will be given out in a separate letter.

Outdoor Learning

The outside temperature continues to drop and while we continue to engage children in outdoor learning, some of the children have started to comment that they are feeling cold when playing outside. We would be grateful if your child came to nursery suitably dressed for taking part in outdoor learning.

Indoor Shoes
