ECO - as you know Blackwood Primary has maintained ECO flag status for many years. One aspect of this is litter. There has been a huge tidy up recently in the village (thanks to those volunteers!), however as we go about our daily exercise we are becoming more and more aware of this as a problem within our community.

The resilience group would like our young people to get involved. On our daily walks can we take pictures of problem areas - litter / dog fouling / plastics and post them online. The young people can then design an A3 poster to remind community members to tidy up (resources can be collected from the church) which in the long term will be used within the community as a message from the young people to keep our community clean and tidy.

This would be used by the ECO committee as evidence once school has returned to normal.
