Guidance and Procedures

- All play equipment should be kept clean and well maintained (appendix 10 - NHS Infection and Prevention Control).
- The nursery should be cleaned.
- There should be adequate levels of ventilation in the nursery and the opening of doors and windows, (where it is safe to do so).
- Measures should be taken to control the spread of infection (Appendix 3), e.g. advising parents about exclusion criteria for infection within the nursery, checklist of standard infection control precautions (Section 4 NHS Infection and Prevention Control).
 - Please report early warning signs and symptoms of infection to the nursery Team Leader or Key Worker to assess the situation. These symptoms include (Section 6.1):
 - Diarrhoea (this is defined as 3 or more very loose or liquid bowel movements within 24 hours)
 - Blood in the child's faeces
 - Vomiting
 - Continuing or severe stomach pain
 - Any kind of rash
 - Flu like symptoms - a fever (temperature of 38 degrees Celsius or higher) and two or more of the following - cough, sore throat, runny nose, limb or joint pain, and headache)
 - Appears unwell (feels hot or looks flushed)



Guidance and Procedures continued

If any one child has any of these symptoms, staff should:

- Keep the child safe and away from other children if possible
- Ask the parent/carer to collect the child and suggest they visit the GP if symptoms get worse
- Put in place the appropriate infection control as described in appendix 8 of the NHS infection control notes.

-If more than one child has any of these signs or symptoms, staff should contact NHS Lanarkshire (see Appendix 5).

-If there is an outbreak of infection (2 or more cases linked to the same illness (e.g. scarlet fever, E.Coli) or a single case of a serious disease (e.g. measles) staff should follow guidelines as described in Section 6 and Appendix 5 and 6 of Infection Prevention and Control in Childcare Settings (2011).

-The manager will notify Care Inspectorate of a suspected or known outbreak of infection. An infection is defined as 2 or more, or a higher than expected number of cases of confirmed or suspected infection, affecting people using the service and/or staff in the same area.

-All staff, parents and carers should be advised that anyone displayed symptoms of Covid-19 should not attend, or should be asked to return home and get tested.

-Parents/carers should be informed at induction days about procedures within the school if the child is unwell e.g. NHS Lanarkshire exclusion procedures, contact the school office if the child is not attending nursery etc.

Guidance and Procedures continued

-Children should be discouraged from bringing toys from home to the setting, however if this is seen as a comforter for an individual child, consideration should be given as to how to safely manage this.

- Staff should adhere to and encourage the children to follow Standard Infection Control Precautions (Section 4 - NHS Infection Prevention and Control):
 - Hand Hygiene
 - Respiratory Hygiene/Cough Hygiene
 - Use Personal Protective Equipment (e.g. gloves/apron)
 - Cleaning of the Environment
 - Dealing with spillages of blood and body fluids
 - Equipment cleanliness e.g. washing with warm soapy water
 - Management of waste
 - Linen and laundry
 - Exposure injuries and bites

- **Enhanced hand hygiene measures:**

Children should wash their hands:

 - Before and after eating
 - After toileting
 - At regular intervals throughout the day

-Children should wash their hands for 20 seconds.

-Encourage children not to touch their face and use a tissue or their elbow to cough and sneeze into.
