Acting Principal Teacher

We are delighted to welcome Mrs Colquhoun, from Newfield Primary to our staff complement as Acting Principal Teacher from Monday 18th December. She was interviewed for this post on Thursday 16th November by a SLC panel which included myself and also representation from our Pupil Leadership Team. We wish her well in her new role. (Ironically, we now have a Miss Colquhoun and a Mrs Colquhoun as our Principal Teachers - no relation!!)

The Future - This information has been shared with the Parent Council

There is a very bleak message around budget cuts within SLC at this moment in time and some of them are having an immediate impact. This term we have lost 0.3FTE (1.5 days staffing) per week and this does have an impact on what we can offer and how we operate. Looking ahead to August 2024 we will lose a DHT post and a further 1.0 FTE teacher. These cuts are being made across all schools within SLC.

Furthermore, with a reduction in per capita per pupil and the rising costs across all purchases from pencils, jotters and toilet roll, the next few years will see cost savings not experienced in my time as a HT.

Read, Write and Count - Wednesday 15th November

This family learning opportunity for Primary 1-3 is hugely popular. The activity bags provided by Book Trust Scotland provide a range of learning opportunities. Big thank you to everyone who supported this event and to Miss Colquboun for organising!




Primary 6 Class Assembly (Mrs Waugh) - Friday 10th November
