
## Parents' Evening

## You + Me Workshop

9 families from Primary 3 and Primary 4 are attending the You + Me Numeracy workshops with Mrs Bennie on a Tuesday afternoon. This is a further opportunity to help support your child's learning at home and enhance your understanding of how your child is taught Numeracy in school. The pupils are really enjoying having a family member in school to play games and spend time with and parents/carers are developing a range of strategies and games to work together on at home.





#### Health Week

We are currently planning a health week in school for the week commencing 13<sup>th</sup> May. During that week we will have Sports Day, welcome visitors into school and participate in activities relating to physical and mental health and wellbeing. If you or someone you know works in or has a special interest in an aspect of health and wellbeing and could spare a few hours during the week please get in touch with the school office and Mrs Colquhoun will get in touch. It might be to deliver a taster session of an activity to inspire pupils (Yoga, mindfulness, fitness etc) or it could be to speak to or provide a workshop to support our focus on developing skills for life, learning and work. Red sweatshirts/leavers hoodies should be worn throughout the week along with t-shirt, leggings/joggies/shorts to ensure pupils are comfortable and ready for any active sessions they will participate in.

## **Athletics**

This term, many classes are developing athletics skills during PE lessons. We have organised for all Primary 6 and 7 pupils to visit the John Cumming Stadium in Carluke on Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> April to experience participating in track and field events. They will take part in 100m, 600m and 4x100m relay using the track and focus on long jump and javelin as field events. A team will then be selected to represent the school at the SLC track and field competition on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> May. There is no cost to families for this trip.

## Science Centre Trip – P2-P4

All pupils from Primary 2-4 will visit the Science Centre on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> May. Whilst there, they will take part in workshops relating to their STEM focus on hydro heroes this term. A packed lunch is required and red sweatshirts should be worn. Pupils should wear comfortable bottoms and shoes, e.g, tracksuit trousers and trainers or leggings and trainers. Pupils should arrive in school on time as buses will depart at 9:15am sharp and they will return by 3pm for collection as normal. In line with Cost of the School Day there is no charge for this trip due to funding received from the Science Centre and Parent Council for travel costs. Teaching staff attended an additional CPD twilight session which allowed all pupils to get free entry to the Science Centre.

#### **Masterclass**

Our final block of Masterclass sessions for Primary 6 and 7 will take place each Friday in May. Pupils have selected from; basketball, football, arts & crafts, Eco/sustainability, music and puzzles/brain games. Each Masterclass will be skills based with development across skills over the 4-week period.

#### Attendance:

We are monitoring attendance closely in line with South Lanarkshire Council (SLC) guidance. Blackwood Primary as a whole school currently have 92.6% attendance. SLC have set a target across the authority of 94.5% so we are currently sitting below that aim. Please continue to ensure your child attends school each day unless they are unwell and notify the school office with the reason for their absence.
