Cost of the School Day

This is a document that we have worked on with our learners, families and Parent Council over a period of time. It reflects the current political and economic climate with a focus on the cost of living.

To help you plan financially please consider the following

Halloween School Party Day 31^{st} October - This will be a dress up or dress down day and all children will be given the opportunity to participate in fun activities. The Parent Council will fund this activity and provide every child with a Glow stick band. Further Glow Sticks can be purchased on the day 3 for £1.

<u>Reduce, Reuse & Recycle</u> - Please hand in any Halloween Costumes you no longer need to the school office for recycling. These will be available at Parents Night on 10th October for you to take at the Parent Council Stop! **Children in Need** - Friday 15th November – This is a non-uniform day. Children can dress up or dress down. The ELC will run the *Children in Need* shop during the week prior to this date. If you can, a donation for this charity can be made on the day.

Christmas – Our traditional *"Carols Around the Tree"* is a whole school performance which will take place on the afternoons of Tuesday 10th, Wednesday 11th and Thursday 12th of December.
